Winter Safety Hints

Winter can be a beautiful time of year, but winter storms and cold temperatures can be dangerous. You can help yourself and our community stay safe and healthy by planning ahead, preparing your home and vehicles, and preparing for power outages and outdoor activities. Winter hazards can include fires, accidents, hypothermia, frostbite, carbon monoxide poisoning, and heart attacks. To prepare for a safe winter season here in our City, here are some important reminders:

Preparing your Home:

- Make sure smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors are operating properly
- * Check your heating system, including fireplaces and chimneys, weather stripping, and insulation
- Have a safe alternate heating system or heating fuels available
- Keep an up-to-date emergency kit in your home and stock non-perishable foods and water
- Keep your cell phone fully charged

Preparing Your Car:

- Service the radiator and check antifreeze levels
- Check tire tread or install winter tires
- Keep the gas tank and windshield washer fluid full, using winter strength washer fluid
- Prepare a winter emergency kit for your car that includes cell phone chargers, sand or cat litter for traction, flashlight, first aid kit, booster cables, tire pump, and food and water
- Keep items in your vehicle such as extra coats, hats, gloves, sleeping bags, and blankets for warmth

Take Precautions Outdoors:

- Wear appropriate outdoor clothing, including a wind-resistant coat or jacket, inner layers of light, warm clothing, mittens, hats, scarves, and waterproof boots
- Sprinkle cat litter or sand on icy patches
- Work slowly when doing outside chores and always carry a cell phone

Altoona's Heritage

If you look at a map of Pennsylvania, you will see many town names with origins in the United Kingdom, which includes the countries of England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland, which we highlighted in the December issue. This month we highlight:

The United Kingdom's Heritage in Altoona, PA

If you have ever looked at a map of Pennsylvania you can immediately see the influence of England, Scotland and Wales here in the State. Both religious and industrial oppression in those countries spawned immigration of people from this area of Europe, known as Anglo-Americans. Towns like Bryn Mawr, Bala Cynwyd and Malvern represent the large number of Quakers, mostly Welsh or British, who emigrated to eastern Pennsylvania, while Lancaster, York, Huntingdon, and Bedford are all familiar town names in England. Our neighboring County of Cambria, the Latin word for Wales, began as a Welsh-American farming colony in the 1790's with a group of 50 Welsh Americans who left Philadelphia to pursue opportunities in central and western Pennsylvania.



In Altoona, the Scottish, Welsh and British immigrant populations were drawn here by the railroad and coal industries, as is the case with many of the people who came to Altoona in the 19th and 20th centuries. Many of the railroad industry's management jobs were held by English, Scotch and Welsh men, as well as Germans. Anglo-Americans became prominent in both industry and government and, today, encompass a large percentage of all American immigrants. While Altoona's current population identifies as only a small percentage of Scottish, Welsh and British ancestry, much of the farming that we see throughout Blair County, as well as Huntingdon and Cambria counties, was begun by Scotch-Irish Americans.

Janet Blair, the Altoona-born actress, was of Scottish descent and another Scottish/Anglo American name that you might recognize here in Altoona is that of Elias Baker, the ironmaster who built the beautiful Baker Mansion. Though not from Altoona, the names of Forbes and Carnegie are also well-known and stem from Great Britian's roots. Our City and State have been enriched by the contributions of these ancestors.
