August is International Overdose Awareness Month

Since 2001, August has been recognized as International Overdose Awareness Month. Specifically in 2025, August 31st is designated as International Overdose Awareness Day. The theme for 2025 is "**One Big Family, Driven By Hope**". The day is not only to remember those we have lost to drug overdose, but also to acknowledge people in our communities who are affected by overdose, but who often go unseen. These people may be family members, loved ones or friends. August 31st is a day to recognize the magnitude of the issue, change the widely-held misperceptions, and reduce the stigma surrounding addiction and overdose.

While many substances can be the source of addiction, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) reports that prescription drug abuse continues to be the fastest growing drug problem in the United States and has been classified as an epidemic. Synthetic opioids, such as fentanyl, continue be the number one cause of drug overdose deaths in the United States. The good news is that the rate of overdose deaths is at its lowest since 2019. The number of drug overdose deaths reported in 2024 showed a decrease of almost 27% from 2023, so the work being done is making a difference!

Here in Altoona, the 7th Annual Blair County International Overdose Awareness Day event will be held on Saturday, August 30th at Trans4mation Church from 4:00 PM – 8:00 PM. 
National Farmers Market Week at Altoona Farmers Market

ArtsAltoona Presents Alter Eagles



Fort Roberdeau Revolutionary War Days



Historic Fort Roberdeau will host Revolutionary War Days encampment and reenactment on Saturday and Sunday, August 9th and 10th, with the grounds opening at 10:00 AM on both days. This has been an annual event at Fort Roberdeau since 1980.

Rangers, militia, miners and settlers all played a role in defending and maintaining the Lead Mine Fort. Revolutionary War Days at Fort Roberdeau recreate the situation that existed on the Pennsylvania Frontier in 1778. During this event you can become immersed in camp life with a story line based on actual local events. A daily battle will be held each afternoon.

This popular program brings the fort to life with authentically outfitted reenactors portraying both patriots and loyalists. Event participants set up period camps and live much as their ancestors did, sleeping in canvas tents, wearing authentic wool and linen clothing and cooking over open fires.

Visitors are encouraged to arrive early and stay through the afternoon. Bring a lawn chair to view the action. Admission and parking are free, and donations are welcome at the gate. Mountain Lion Backpack Program

Students will soon head back to school and, again this year, the Mountain Lion Backpack Program will be helping children from food-insecure homes, where they may have little or nothing to eat when not in school. Throughout the school year, these children will be provided with breakfasts, lunches, dinners and snacks to get them through the weekends.

In Blair County, over 13% of school children face food insecurity, which is higher than the national average. Last year, the Mountain Lion Backpack Program served over 1,100 children, at a cost of approximately \$6.00 per child per week. The Program receives no funding from local, state or federal government sources, operating solely through fundraising efforts and donations from individuals, businesses and organizations.

This year, you can help in two ways. You can sponsor one or more children at different sponsorship levels (\$210 per year per child). You can also participate in this year's Battle of the Backpacks! Any business, group or organization that wishes to help feed our local children can enter the challenge and compete to see which group collects the most food donations during the month of September.
