

## Altoona Police Department 2023 Yearly Review






### Calls for Service

- Over 28,102 calls for service handled
  - ► Average of 77 Calls Per Day
  - ▶ 10% increase in calls from 2022
- Approximately 2,000 arrests made
- Responded to over 200 drug overdoses
  - ▶ 13 Doses of Narcan administered
  - ▶ DDRD Team investigated 28 OD Deaths
  - 4 Arrests were made as a result



## UCR Summary Six Year Comparison Homicide Offenses




# UCR Summary Six Year Comparison Aggravated Assault Offenses

#### Decreased 12.9% in 2023




# UCR Summary Six Year Comparison Drug Offenses

#### Decreased .4% in 2023




# UCR Summary Six Year Comparison Motor Vehicle Theft Offenses

#### Increased 46.4% in 2023




# UCR Summary Six Year Comparison Larceny Offenses

Decreased 10.8% in 2023




# UCR Summary Six Year Comparison Burglary Offenses

Decreased 3.4% in 2023




### UCR Summary Six Year Comparison Robbery Offenses



### New Hires

- 9 New Officers were hired
  - ▶ This is a department wide effort year in and year out
  - Current Officers are responsible for staffing physical agility test dates, specializing in background investigations, Computer Voice Stress Analysis Testing, and new hire orientation tasks

### Department Initiatives 2023

- ▶ Funding From Operation Our Town helped startup the K-9 Unit
  - ► K-9 Blue and Pongo have been wildly successful in taking drugs off the streets however their real passion is meeting and speaking with local students!





### Department Initiatives 2023

- K-9 Blue and K-9 Pongo Statistics
  - ► To date: 105 deployments
  - ► Resulting in 43 Arrests
  - Seizures include Methamphetamine, Heroin, Cocaine, Crack Cocaine, Ecstasy, Suboxone, Kolonopin, Liquid Methadone, and Hydrocodone

### Department Initiatives 2023

- Starting in November, (2) Officers were temporarily assigned to a newly formed traffic unit
- Officers worked a 6 week rotation focusing on moving violations, parking complaints, and outstanding warrants
- ▶ In (2) months those Officers were responsible for:
  - ▶ 511 Calls
  - ▶ 200 Traffic Citations
  - ▶ 18 Arrests
  - Most notable arrest was an early morning traffic stop for a speeder passing a school bus. Driver was arrested for narcotics possession and a stolen firearm

### Community Events

- ▶ 15 APD Officers ran 6.7 miles through the City of Altoona, raising \$1,800 for the PA Special Olympics in the Law Enforcement Torch Run
- 12 APD Officers jumped in the frigid waters of Canoe Creek for the Polar Plunge, raising \$5,330 for the PA Special Olympics
- ▶ 50 APD officers participated in the 3<sup>rd</sup> annual "No Shave November" program, donating \$3,100 to Easter for Eli, benefitting children battling cancer.





### Community Events

- APD hosted numerous other charity events including: National Night Out, Home Run Derby at the Altoona Curve, Cocoa with the Popo, and placed 400 flags on Veteran grave sites at Fairview Cemetery on Memorial Day
- Christmas present donations were collected in the APD front lobby as the department teamed up with Professional's Auto body to provide Christmas morning for over 100 local children in need this holiday season
