August is International Overdose Awareness Month

In 2001, a Salvation Army worker in Australia began the initiative that has become Overdose Awareness Month, with specific focus on August 31st as International Overdose Awareness Day.

The theme of the 2023 Overdose Awareness Campaign is "Recognizing those people who go unseen" and is about acknowledging the people in our communities who are affected by overdose, but go unseen in the crisis. This can include family members, loved ones and friends. August 31st is a day to remember, without stigma, those we've lost to overdose, acknowledge the grief of those left behind and renew the commitment to end overdose and related harms.

The Centers for Disease Control reports that the United States saw over 107,000 overdose-related deaths in 2022, with 80,000 of those involving synthetic opioids. The most common of these is fentanyl, a synthetic opioid that is 50-100 times more potent than morphine or heroin. The distribution and use of illicitly made fentanyl has increased drastically in the last decade, driving the subsequent increase in opioid-related deaths.

The good news is that Naloxone, a life-saving medication that can reverse an opioid overdose, can be administered by anyone and is readily available free of charge to all adults to have on hand.

Southern Alleghenies Museum of Art

Southern Alleghenies Museum of Art (SAMA) is a community art museum founded in 1976. It has the distinction of being the nation's longest running museum satellite system, with five locations in southwest Pennsylvania, serving six counties.

The Altoona location was opened in 1979, and in 1995, moved to its current location in the Brett Building in downtown Altoona. SAMA maintains a permanent collection of over 7,500 works of art. The collections feature national artists like Mary Cassatt, Andy Warhol, and Gilbert Stuart, as well as local and regional artists such as Frederick Counsel, George Hetzel, and William H. Rau. The SAMA collection boasts works in many mediums, including wood, glass, photography and painting, among others, shown in 30-40 exhibits annually.

In addition to exhibits, SAMA offers Arts-in-Education programs, art camps for children, and many other education programs and special events. SAMA is always looking to expand its current collection, and offers a Call for Artists on an ongoing basis. The museum system welcomes about 81,000 visitors annually at its five locations.



Admission to SAMA is free; however, the museum operates on admission and online donations, proceeds from the online and on-site gift shop, and a group of dedicated volunteers. SAMA Altoona's unique annual fundraiser, Dueling Pianos, is a cocktail and hors d'oeuvres fundraiser with a live musical performance by the Flying Ivories dueling piano group.
