April is Autism Awareness Month

National Autism Awareness Month began in 1972 as National Autistic Children's Week. Founded by the Autism Society, it raises awareness for autism and Asperger's syndrome and fosters change in schools, communities, medical facilities, and businesses. Autism is a complex brain disorder that often inhibits a person's ability to communicate, respond to surroundings, and form relationships with others.

According to the World Health Organization, about one out of every 270 people in the world has Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD). ASD is a group of developmental disabilities that causes challenges in many areas of one's life that include social, communication, and behavior issues. Children with ASD are usually nonverbal or they have restricted or repetitive behaviors. ASD also affects people of all racial, ethnic, and socioeconomic backgrounds.

Activities this month are centered around increased knowledge of autism and imparting information about the importance of early diagnosis and early intervention. It also serves as a reminder that autism is a lifelong condition with varying degrees of severity. It's important to continue to support research for treatment and therapies that will improve the lives of those with autism.



Locally, the Central PA Autism Society covers five counties in Pennsylvania, including Blair. The organization creates 4-5 sensory events a month for children with autism and all disabilities. They also host the sensory movie series, the sensory library, and other life skill events. All events are free, but require participants to register. The Central PA Autism Society also meets once a month as a support group to help the area parents network with one another. For more information, please visit:



If it weren't for the telecommunicators doing their jobs, billions of lives would have been lost due to untimely assistance.

According to an article in "Business Insider," emergency call takers scored 98.5 out of 100 in stress tolerance, making their profession one of the most stressful jobs in America. These lines are open 24/7, so the need for emergency dispatchers is critical and increasing at a steady rate. More than 250 million emergency calls are made to dispatchers every year in the U.S. Despite this, staffing is difficult because 911 operators are often underpaid. Healthy Blair County Coalition-Fighting Fraud

History Highlight

April is the time when the circus comes to town, so this month we highlight:

Jaffa Shrine Center

If you were born and raised in Altoona, it is hard to recall a time when there was not an annual circus at the Jaffa Shrine! Now referred to as the Jaffa Shrine Center, this 3,200-seat arena was not the original Shrine. The first Jaffa Shrine was located on Chestnut Avenue and 7th Street and opened in 1910. However, as membership grew, the facility became too small for the needs of the patrons, so the present facility on Broad Avenue was built.

The idea for the Mosque was formulated by a group of 200 Altoona-based members of the Syria Mosque in Pittsburgh. Its jurisdiction today covers the counties of Blair, Potter, Cameron, Centre, Clearfield, Clinton, Jefferson, Cambria, Huntingdon, Mifflin, Fulton and Bedford. The current Shrine Center, headquarters to the Jaffa Shriners, was built and opened in 1930. Housing an 80 x 30 foot main stage a 25,000 square foot banquet room, and two additional lounges, it was the largest convention center in Blair County until the Blair County Convention Center was built.

In addition to 83 years of hosting the circus, today this beautiful structure is also host to receptions, conventions, sports and dance events, concerts, graduations and more. The Shrine's charitable arm is the Shriner's Hospitals for Children, a network of children's hospitals in the United States, Canada, and Mexico.
